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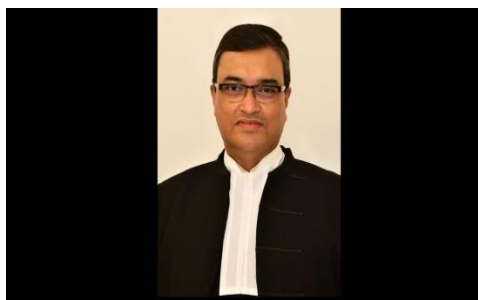

University is also planning to add more specializations from new academic year. The University also hosts several research programme in association with foreign universities.

The University is steered by distinguished judges, senior advocates, eminent academicians, seasoned and senior bureaucrats as members of governing bodies and they guide our students with their rich and valuable experience. He is a legal professional with over 31 years of experience in law including litigation pertaining to the Civil, Criminal and Banking sectors as well as in the Academic field with teaching and research experience. He is holding the charge of Registrar of the Maharashtra National Law University Mumbai. He also serves as the Director of the Centre for Research in Criminal Justice and the Chair Professor of Justice M.L. Pendse Chair in Environmental Laws at the Institute. Before joining Maharashtra National Law University Mumbai in 2019, he served as the Professor, Head of the Institution and Deputy Director at Amity University's Law School, Mumbai. He has also served as the Professor, Officer on Special Duty, and Head of the Department of PG Studies at Maharashtra National Law University Mumbai and the Faculty in charge and Co-ordinator of SNDT Women's University's Law School. He has appeared before the Parliamentary Standing Committee on The Clinical Establishments (Registration and Regulation) Bill, 2007. With over two decades in the legal profession, he teaches Constitutional Law, Corporate Governance, International Humanitarian Law, Comparative Public Law and Environment Law. He has authored four books and more than thirty articles. Three Ph.Ds have been awarded under his supervision. He is currently working on editing his new book titled Handbook on International Environmental Law, published by Thomson Reuters India (upcoming 2022). He is also the Program Director of the Asian Research Colloquium on Constitutional Law 2021-22 organised by Maharashtra National Law University Mumbai in collaboration with the Centre for Asian Legal Studies, Faculty of Law, National University Singapore, University of Colombo, Sri Lanka and Indian Law Institute, New Delhi. He has delivered more than 1000 guest talks and lectures across the country. His experience is in curriculum framing, setting

up of the Law Schools and Universities, academic administration and training Professors and researchers.

➤ Profile of the University

Towards attaining these objectives, MNLU Mumbai offers Five year integrated B.A., LL.B. (Hons.), One year LL.M. (Regular), One Year LL.M. (Investment and Securities Law) jointly with NISM, One Year LL.M. (Professional), M.A. (Executive) in Mediation and Conflict Resolution, Ph.D. programme among other diplomas and short term courses. The University also runs various certificate courses such as Mediation, Data Protection Law, Cyber Law, IPR, Arbitration and foreign languages such as German and Spanish on regular basis.

MNLU Mumbai is a vibrant institute that explores the curious legal dimensions of public policy, ethics, business, and a plethora of issues in order to produce quality legal scholarship, capable of facing the real world challenges. From its very inception, MNLU Mumbai has aimed to attain excellence in all aspects of legal training and education. It encourages students to engage in a host of curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for their mental, physical and professional growth. No wonder, the students are leaving their indelible imprint by winning numerous mootings, debating and sports competitions of national and international repute thereby putting the University firmly on the national circuit.

The University has entered into a number of MoUs with national and international institutes. Internationally, the University has ties with L'Universite' Paris Nanterre, Berlin School of Economics and Law (BSEL), Germany, American University, Washington DC and others. The University boasts its research output via a dedicated Department of Research and 15 research centres including Centre for Research in Criminal Justice (CRCJ), Centre for Arbitration and Research (CAR), Centre for Information Communication Technology and Law (CICTL), Centre for Advanced Training in Taxation Laws (CATTTL), Centre for Mediation and Research (CMR), Centre for Training & Research in Commercial Regulations (CTRCCR), Centre for Research in Intellectual Property (CRIP), Centre for Women, Law and Gender Justice (CWLGC), Centre for Insolvency and Financial Laws (CIFL), Centre for Clinical Legal Education (CCLE), Centre for Advanced Legal Studies, Training & Research (CALSTR), Centre for Maritime Law and Research (CML&R), Centre for Research in Air & Space Law (CRASL). The University has established two sponsored research Chairs one is Justice M. L. Pendse Chair in Environmental Laws and other is IPR Chair under the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT).

MNLU Mumbai being located in the coveted Hiranandani Gardens, Powai, has wide exposure to the sprawling urban facilities of Mumbai city. The campus location is in proximity to IIT Bombay and is 13 kms from the Chhatrapati Shivaji International Airport. The student's hostel (boys and girls) is located just across the campus. At present the university functions from its rented building located in the MTNL Building. The centrally air conditioned floors of the Academic block of the university have all essential amenities like smart classrooms, library, reading room, moot court hall, mediation centre, legal service clinic, internship cell, board room and conference hall etc., ideal for optimizing the students' learning, research, training and extension activities. The University facilitates access to a well-equipped library with a large number of books, law journals, magazines and subscription to multiple online databases such as JStor, Hein Online, SCC Online, Manupatra, Oxford Publications, Lexis Nexis, EBC Reader, Proview and Westlaw. Very soon the university will shift to its own land and the building project is being planned and the Govt of Maharashtra is providing due support to develop the building of the university.

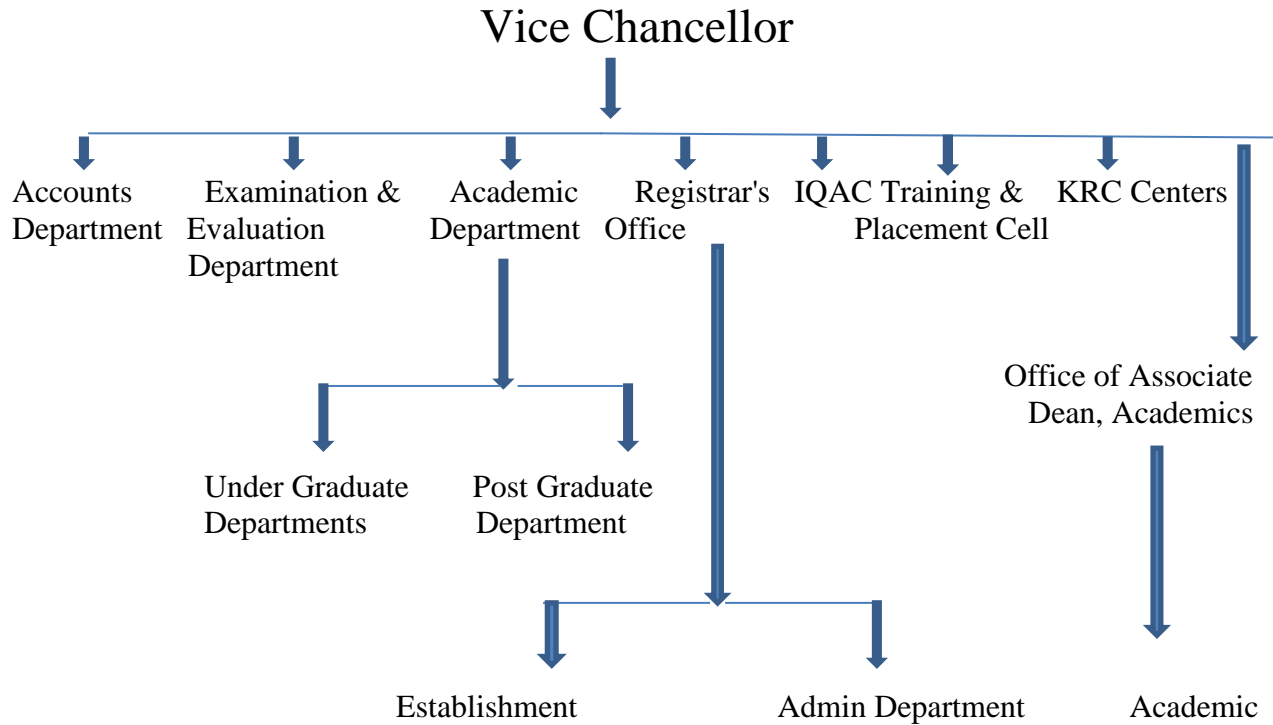


➤ **Objective of the Maharashtra National Law University Mumbai**

Scholarship Facilities at MNLU Mumbai

The Scholarship Department of the University has been functional since 2015 and facilitates the students in securing scholarships offered by Governments, NGOs, or philanthropic agencies viz.

Scholarships Briefing Schedule:

- a. The **Government of Maharashtra: (MAHADBT)** – This facility of scholarship is provided by the Govt. of Maharashtra to Maharashtra domiciled students; under this portal (MahaDBT) various scholarships are available to candidates as per their eligibility.
- b. **The Government of Madhya Pradesh:** This scholarship scheme (*Medhavi Yojana*) is offered exclusively by the Madhya Pradesh Government for Madhya Pradesh State-domiciled students.
- c. **The Government of Rajasthan:** This scholarship scheme (*Mukhya Mantri Sarvajan Uchha Shiksha Chhatravriti Yojana*) is being offered by the Rajasthan Government exclusively for Rajasthan State-domiciled students only.
- d. **National Scholarships Portal (NSP)** – This is a common portal for various Scholarship schemes at all Indian levels; in which most scholarships would be offered to All Indian candidates (Non-Maharashtra and Maharashtra Candidates), Minority candidates, and Handicapped candidates.
- e. **Top Class Education:** The Scheme aims at recognizing and promoting quality education amongst students belonging to SCs, by providing full financial support. The scheme will cover SC students' scholarships for pursuing higher studies.
- f. **Foundation for Excellence Scholarship Programme:**

The Foundation for Excellence, a 28-year-old registered NGO awards merit cum means scholarships to gifted students from financially deprived backgrounds pursuing Engineering, Medical, Law, BPharm, and Integrated MTech degrees in India. The mission is to transform their lives and transition them to a higher economic bracket in a single generation.

The financial support for students through scholarships is combined with skills training for Engineering students (supported by a grant from the Michael and Susan Dell Foundation and Capgemini), along with opportunities for employee engagement, particularly mentoring, projects, internships, workshops, and similar, that makes this a well-rounded program for students, and is the largest program of its kind with a pan India presence (27 States).

Scholarship Department MNLU Mumbai.

Our students have been applying for these scholarships throughout the year. Mainly, our students have also been receiving scholarships each year as per the various scholarship schemes' patterns and their eligibility.

Library Department

The library plays a vital role in supporting the academic programs of the institute. The Maharashtra National Law University Mumbai library exemplifies excellence in both services and collections. Its shelves hold over **10,764** volumes, including print and electronic formats. This collection comprises textbooks, reference books, treatises, bare acts, handbooks, encyclopedias, dictionaries, directories, commission reports, and subordinate legislation. The library features extensive resources in law and allied subjects such as management, sociology, science and technology, history, economics, and English literature. The library's e-resources include online access to HeinOnline, Manupatra, Oxford Competition Law, Oxford Constitutional Law, ORIL-International Law, Westlaw, Taxmann, JSTOR Full Package, LexisNexis, EBC Reader, LiveLaw, OLRL-Legal Research Library, IC-Investment Claims, Oxford Law Citator, ProView (e-books), and Economic and Political Weekly. The Law Reports are also available in print.

❖ Installed RFID System:

- The RFID system, installed in 2020, is designed to streamline and enhance library operations by providing faster, more accurate, and secure services. It significantly

improves efficiency, accuracy, and security. By automating routine tasks like checkouts, returns, and renewals, and incorporating theft detection at the gates, the library provides faster and more reliable service to users, while reducing manual labor and minimizing errors. The combination of RFID tags, smart card readers, staff stations, and gate antennas creates a seamless and secure library experience.

- RFID Tags: RFID tags, attached to books, store detailed information about each book, including its unique identification number, allowing the system to track the book efficiently.
 - Smart Card Reader: The smart card reader facilitates transactions involving library users. Students or patrons use RFID-based smart cards for transactions like borrowing, returning, or renewing books.
 - Staff Station Reader: The staff station reader is used by library staff to perform RFID tagging and circulation operations, ensuring accurate inventory and transaction records.
 - Gate Antenna System: The gate antenna system monitors the movement of tagged materials, preventing theft or unauthorized removal of books.
 - Handheld Reader: The handheld reader is used for on-the-go scanning of RFID tags, making inventory checks, stock-taking, and book searches more efficient.
- ❖ Turnitin: Turnitin is proprietary software used to check documents for similarities or potential instances of plagiarism.
 - ❖ Digital Attendance Systems: Digital attendance systems have also been installed.

❖ User Education Programs

The MNLU Mumbai KRC organizes annual "Legal Information Literacy Orientation Programs" for undergraduate and postgraduate students. Individual guidance is also provided to students to enable them to retrieve information from library resources. The objectives of these programs are to introduce library resources and services and to develop users' competencies in retrieving needed information. This year, four programs were conducted, and 600 participants (UG, PG, MBA, PG IPR, and other centers) were trained in the use of various information resources.

Significant usage of HeinOnline, Manupatra, Oxford Competition Law, Taxmann, JSTOR, LexisNexis, EBC Reader, and LiveLaw was observed. These services are made available to faculty and research students through password-based access.

- Responsibilities of Academic Department

1. Student Record Management:

- Prepare individual student files for academic records.
- Maintain and update student files and academic records.

2. Student Enrolment and Data Management:

- Issue enrolment numbers to newly admitted students.
- Enter student data in excel sheets and circulate to departments.
- Create institutional email IDs and group emails for students.

3. Academic Calendar and Time Table:

- Format and circulate academic calendars and time tables for each semester.

4. Event and Program Management:

- Circulate invitations for events, programs, seminars, and webinars to students and staff.

5. Student ID Cards and Attendance:

- Prepare data for student ID cards and scan photos of new students.
- Record and publish attendance for B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and LL.M. (regular) batches.

6. Student Participation and Reimbursement:

- Record student participation in Moot Court, ADR, Debate, and other activities.
- Verify reimbursement forms and documents for competitions.

7. Administrative Tasks:

- Prepare notes for approval on student, faculty, and society-related matters.
- Send required student documents via speed post.
- Create academic files as requested by faculty.

8. Railway Concession Forms:

- Prepare lists of eligible students for submitting Faculty Feedback.

1. Visiting Faculty Payment Processing:

- Collect attendance sheets from visiting faculty.
- Prepare consolidated payment statements.
- Coordinate with visiting faculty to verify lecture details and process monthly payments.

2. Guest Faculty Payment Processing:
- Process payments for guest faculty.

3. Student Refund Processing:
- Prepare and share a Google sheet with other departments to process refundable deposits for graduating students.
- Process refunds for students who withdraw from courses.
- Process refunds for extra fees, including hostel, mess, and late fees.
