

Introduction and Rationale

Disputes are an inevitable part of interactions. Due to increasing delays, costs, and adversarial outcomes in litigation, Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) mechanisms⁴ arbitration, mediation, and negotiation⁴ have become preferred globally.

India's strong policy push for ADR, including the Mediation Act and international commitments, highlights the urgent need for trained professionals. The legal landscape demands practitioners with doctrinal knowledge, practical competence, and emotional intelligence.

The Post Graduate Diploma in Arbitration and Mediation (PG-DAM) is a one-year, practice-oriented programme equipping graduates and professionals with skills to effectively function as arbitrators, mediators, negotiation professionals, ADR counsel, policy professionals, and academics.

- Produce high-quality academic and practice-oriented research in ADR.

Semester I – Course Descriptions

Comparative Conflict Resolution Process

1 Explores dispute resolution modes, adversarial and non-adversarial approaches, mediation history, ethics, and online dispute resolution.

Domestic and International Arbitration

2 Comprehensive study of Indian and international arbitration law, covering agreements, proceedings, awards, and enforcement.

Practice of Mediation

3 Hands-on training in mediation process, communication, negotiation techniques, and various mediation styles including facilitative and transformative.

Mediation 3 Law and Theory

4 Examines legal frameworks regulating mediation across dispute categories, Singapore Convention, and online mediation practices.

Research Methodology

5 Develops research skills in doctrinal and empirical methods, data collection, ethics, and academic writing.

Semester II – Course Descriptions

Investment Arbitration and Conflict of Law

1 Covers international investment law, ICSID procedures, jurisdictional issues, and choice of law in international arbitration.

Psychology and Mediation

2 Explore emotional intelligence, mindfulness, handling difficult personalities, restorative justice, and NLP techniques in mediation.

Drafting, Pleadings & Witness Handling in Arbitration

3 Practical training in drafting arbitration documents, witness examination, closing arguments, and professional conduct.

Role Play Simulation and Report Writing (Clinical)

4 Hands-on clinical training through role play simulations and report writing to develop real-world dispute resolution skills.

Research Report/Thesis

5 Independent research project culminating in a comprehensive dissertation on arbitration, mediation, or ADR topics.
